Mr. and Mrs. C. P. Hirschy of Wabash township will attend the funeral services at Hesperia, tomorrow.

Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Myers went to Jackson, Mich., this morning to visit their daughter, Mrs. Walter Barklow.

Mrs. Jacob Eley and Mrs. Frank Allen went to Geneva yesterday to visit their sister, Mrs. Campbell.

Miss Viola Sprunger went to Fort Wayne, Wednesday to work at the John Von Gunten home. The Von Gunten baby is very sick.

After a sickness of more than 25 years, death came as a relief to Mrs. Christian C. Burry who died at the family home on North Sprunger street last evening.

The wedding of Miss Rachel Habegger to Noah Schrock was solemnized at the Christian church in the presence of the congregation with Rev. Jacob J. Schwartz performing the ceremony.

Workman began this morning to remove the bodies from the old cemetery in the west part of town. About 150 bodies remain there and these will all be removed to the M.R.E. cemetery west of town. Some of the bodies have been buried over fifty years, while the last burial in this cemetery was 26 years ago. In some of the graves no traces of the dead bodies remain, while in others the bones and parts of clothing remain.
