Noah T. Schrock, 86, father of Noah N. Schrock, and grandfather of Noah J. Schrock, passed away at his home near Dover, Ohio (crossed out and handwritten 'Delaware'), Tuesday morning from complications and old age. He was a retired farmer.

The decedent was born in Holmes county, Ohio, November 4, 1853, the son of Tobias Schrock. He moved from Ohio to Arizona and later resided near Berne for two years, again moving to Ohio.

His first marriage was to Lydia Hershberger and some time after her death in 1918 he was married to Mary Schwartzentruber who preceded two years ago.

Surviving are six sons and five daughters: Ananias of Alabama, Joseph of Arthur, Ill., Daniel and Jacob of Phoenix, Ariz., Noah N. of Berne, Peter, Mrs. Elizabeth Beachy, Mrs. Eli Chupp, Mrs. Jacob Hershberger, and Mrs. Jacob Wengard, all of Delaware, and Mrs. Emma Yoder of Lumberton, Miss.

Funeral services will be held at the Jacob Beachy home near Dover Friday afternoon and Noah Schrock of this place left today to attend the final rites.
