Mrs. Willis Lehman Dies Today at Home Near Bluffton

Mrs. Willis Lehman, 29, died at her home five and one-half miles south of Bluffton this morning at 5:30 o'clock. Death was attributed to a heart ailment. The family moved to their present location about a year ago from their home south of Monroe.

The deceased was born March 19, 1910, in Liberty township, Wells county, a daughter of Roy and Minnie Collins Hendricks, who are both surviving and live in Bluffton. She married Willis Lehman, who also survives, November 9, 1929, in Bluffton. She was a member of the Reformed Evangelical church.

Surviving besides the husband and parents are two children Sharon Dian and Larry Lee; the following sisters, Mrs. Tilman Augsburger, Dayton, Ohio; Mrs. John Lehman, Geneva; Mrs. Frank Woodard, Tocsin; Mrs. Carl Sawyer, Bluffton and Miss Nina Hendricks, Bluffton. A brother is deceased.

The body will remain at the Jahn funeral home in Bluffton, until time for the funeral, services will be held Monday at 1:30 p.m. at the Reformed church. Rev. Matthew Worthman will officiate.

Funeral services for Mrs. Barbara Adler, 92, widow of the late John George Adler, who died Saturday afternoon, will be held Tuesday morning at 10 o'clock at the residence, 349 Winchester street.

Mrs. Adler died Saturday afternoon at 1:10 o'clock at her home. Death was attributed to complications. She had been a resident of this city for the past 25 years and was a member of the St. John's Lutheran church in Fort Wayne.

She was born in Warren, Pennsylvania, November 27, 1847, the daughter of Michael and Barbara Gander-Huser. She was married on October 22, 1871 at Fort Wayne. The couple moved to this city from Linn Grove.

Surviving are the following children: George and Henry Adler and Mrs. Orville Harruff, of Decatur; Edwin and Anna Adler, at home; a sister, Mrs. Lena Neaderhouser of Markle. Two sisters and a brother preceded her in death.

The body was taken to the residence from the S. E. Black funeral home Sunday afternoon. It may be viewed there until time for the services. Rev. E. J. Boeger of Fort Wayne, assisted by Rev. George S. Lozier of Decatur will officiate. Burial will be in the St. John's Lutheran cemetery at Fort Wayne.
