INJURIES ARE FATAL TO MAN Abe Bollenbacher Of Near Rockford Dies Sunday Night

Abe Bollenbacher, 55, farmer of near Rockford, Ohio, died at 11 o'clock Sunday night at the Adams county memorial hospital, as the result of injuries sustained last Thursday afternoon.

Bollenbacher suffered a fractured right leg in attempting to halt a runaway horse. He

was brought to the local hospital. Death was caused by gangrene. The Ohio farmer is survived by the widow and one daughter, Mrs. Isabelle Lautzenheiser, at home.

Bollenbacher attempted to halt the horse as it bolted while being ridden by the

victim's 10-year-old cousin, Norbert Bollenbacher.

When he grabbed the horse, it threw him to the ground, causing his injuries. Funeral arrangements had not been completed at a late hour this afternoon.
