DEATH CLAIMS JAMES MOSES

Well Known Adams County Man Dies Late Sunday Afternoon

James Moses, 89, pioneer Adams county resident, died Sunday evening at 4 o'clock at the home of his son, Dale D. Moses, in Root township.

The deceased was born in Carol county, Ohio, January 27, 1851, the son of Samuel and Eliza Hunter-Moses.

He came to this county when a young man and with the exception of five years in Colorado and Canada, had lived in Adams county since that time.

He was married to Emily D. Dailey April 8, 1880. She preceded him in death April 30, 1934. He was a member of the First Presbyterian church.

Surviving are two sons, Caroll of Fort Wayne and Dale of near Decatur; a foster-daughter, Mrs. W. R. McCoy of Dayton, Ohio, and a brother, Edgar, of Union township. A brother and two sisters are deceased.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock at the home of the son, Dale, and at 2 o'clock at the First Presbyterian church in this city, of which he was a member. Rev. George O. Walton will officiate. Burial will be in the Decatur cemetery.

The body will be returned to the son's residence, one mile north of Decatur on federal road 27, from the Zwick funeral home Tuesday afternoon and may be viewed there (cut off)
