Three-Year-Old Girl is Fatally Burned in Mishap

Helen Pauline Sills of Near Peterson Victim of Tragedy

Helen Pauline Sills, three-year-old daughter of Walter and Pauline Miller Sills of Adams County, former residents of Wells County, died at 5:50 am Tuesday at the Adams County Hospital in Decatur from burns received in an accident Monday evening.

The tragedy occurred between 6:30 and 7:00 while the parents were doing chores on their farm, one mile east of Peterson. The child's dress caught fire from a small laundry stove. A brother, Ralph, 12, who was in the house at the time, grabbed a throw rug and wrapped his sister in it and had the fire almost out before the mother reached the house. The child was rushed immediately to the hospital.

The child was born in Wells County.

Surviving besides the parents are the grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Emanuel Miller, near Monroeville, two sisters and four brothers, Ralph, Isaac, Joyce, Ruth and Junior, all at home.

The body will be left that the Jahn Funeral Home at Bluffton until funeral services, which will be held at 2 pm Thursday at the Pleasant Dale Church of the Brethren in charge of Rev. Russell Weller. Burial will be in the church cemetery.
