Saloma Yoder Dies at Home West of Berne Funeral Thursday for 65-Year-Old Woman; Dies of Meningitis

Miss Saloma Yoder, 65, well known French Township woman, died at 3:30 o'clock Monday afternoon at her home west of Berne, along state road 118. Death was caused by meningitis. She had been ill about two weeks and meningitis developed following a siege of the flu. Miss Yoder made her home with her sister, Mrs. Mary Rich, for the past 26 years. She was never married.

The deceased was born in Wabash Township, September 17, 1876, a daughter of Jacob and Catherine Stucky Yoder. She spent her entire life in this community.

Surviving are three brothers and three sisters, as follows: Joshua, Enoch and Jacob J. Yoder, all of this community; Mrs. Mary Rich of west of Berne, Mrs. Elizabeth Biberstein of Fort Wayne and Mrs. Emma Nichols of Berne.

Four brothers and one sister are deceased. They are David, Noah, Henry and John Yoder and Mrs. Katherine Rich.

The funeral will be held Thursday afternoon at 1:00 o'clock at the home and at 1:30 o'clock at the Defenseless Mennonite Church, of which she was a member. Rev. N. J. Schmucker will officiate. Burial will be in the church cemetery.
