Mr. and Mrs. B. F. Welty, W. Market Street, Lima, Ohio, Tuesday announced the marriage of their daughter, Jeanne to Furth Ullman of New York City and Laguna Beach, Calif., which took place Sunday afternoon, June 28, in the Collegiate Church of St. Nicholas, at New York City. Dr. Joseph R. Sizoo, pastor of the church, officiated at the ceremony.

The bride is well known here. Her mother was formerly Cora Gottschalk of this place.

The bride, who is a graduate of Lima Central High School, attended Rockford and Wooster Colleges, and was graduated in dramatic art from the Cincinnati College of Music. She studied with Francis Robinson-Duff of New York and at the Pasadena Playhouse and Max Reinhardt's Work Shop in Hollywood, Calif. For the past few years she has been touring in the presentation of mono-dramas for the coming season. Mrs. Ullman is a member of the Lima Junior Service League.

### Harvey E. Meyer Dies This Morning

#### Former French Twp. Man, Brother of Local Woman Dies at Fort Wayne

Harvey E. Meyer, 53, of Fort Wayne, a former resident of French Township and the brother of Mrs. Orval Allspaw of Berne, died this morning at 4:20 o'clock at the St. Joseph's Hospital at Fort Wayne. Death was caused by appendicitis and complications. He had been in the hospital since last Tuesday and seriously ill for several days.

Mr. Meyer was born in French Township on December 9, 1888, a son of Henry A. and Bertha Gehrig Meyer. His parents are deceased. He was married to Elizabeth Huebner on August 4, 1909. The couple lived on a farm in French Township until 1918 and had resided in Fort Wayne the past ten years where Mr. Meyer was a street car conductor.

Surviving are the widow and the following children: Mrs. Eunice Phelps, Chicago; Mrs. Dorothy Draper, LaGrange; Dale and Harry Meyer, Mrs. Hawena Freimuth, Mrs. Helen Royce and Mrs. Eileen Sutterbein, all of Fort Wayne, and Theodore Wayne Meyer and Mary Meyer, both at home.

Two brothers and a sister survive. They are Edward Meyer of Tacoma, Washington, Reuben J. Meyer of Monroe and Mrs. Orval (Lovina) Allspaw, of Berne. Two sons, Elmer and Edward and two brothers and a sister preceded.

The funeral will be held Thursday at 2:00 pm at the Salem Reformed Church at Fort Wayne of which Mr. Meyer was a member. Burial will be in the M.R.E. Cemetery west of Berne.
