Henry Schieferstein Dies This Morning
Retired Farmer Dies After Long Illness

Henry G. Schieferstein, 74, retired Root Township farmer, died at 6 o'clock this morning at his home, six miles north of Decatur on Federal Road 27. Death was caused by heart trouble and complications, following an illness of several years.

He was born in Allen County August 31, 1867, the son of George and Elizabeth Braun-Schieferstein. He married Christina Kaiser October 14, 1897. He was a member of St. John's Lutheran Church.

Surviving besides the widow are a son, Edward, at home; two daughters, Mrs. George Roos and Mrs. Kenneth Kause, both of Fort Wayne; three brothers, Fred of Fort Wayne, Phillip and George, both of Monmouth and 10 grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at 1:30 pm Tuesday at the home and at 2 o'clock at the church, Rev. A. R. Treulzsch officiating. Burial will be in Concordia Cemetery at Fort Wayne. The body will be returned to the residence from the Zwick Funeral Home at 2:30 o'clock Sunday afternoon.
