Wife of Orten Wheeler is Dead

Well Known Woman Dies East of Geneva from Paralysis

Mrs. Emma Wheeler, aged 71, died Thursday morning at 9:30 o'clock at the home, three miles east of Geneva. Death resulted from paralysis. Her condition had been serious for the past 12 weeks.

The deceased was a daughter of Joseph and Jane (Linton) Anderson and was born near Geneva, March 9, 1871. Her entire life had been spent in the vicinity of Geneva.

On October 15, 1896, she was married to Orton F. Wheeler, who survives with three sons, Emerson Wheeler of near Muncie; John Wheeler of Fort Wayne and Joseph Wheeler, at home.

She is also survived by a daughter-in-law, Mrs. Dumont Wheeler, of Geneva. The deceased was the last of a family of six children.

Funeral services will be conducted Saturday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock from the Apple Grove United Brethren Church, four miles east of Geneva. Rev. Delbert Cress, pastor of the church will officiate. Interment will be made in Riverside Cemetery.
