Ulysses S. Drummond Dies Tuesday Night
Funeral Services Saturday Afternoon

Ulysses S. Drummond, 76, lifetime resident of Adams County and a veteran employee of the Niblick and Co. store died at 11:30 o'clock Tuesday night at his home, 621 West Adams Street. Death was caused by complications and followed an illness of three weeks.

He was born in Adams County August 30, 1867, the son of William D. and Martha Edward-Drummond. He was employed by the Niblick store for more than 30 years until forced to retire three weeks ago because of ill health.

He was a member of the First United Brethren Church and of the Ben Hur and I.O.O.F. Lodge in this city. He was married to Corintha Ann Nelson, who preceded him in death 12 years ago.

Surviving are twin daughters, Mrs. Harry Sulton and Mrs. Cecil Harvey, both of Decatur; a son, William Drummond of Muskegon, Michigan and a sister, Mrs. Henry Yocum of Rockford, Ohio. Two sons and one brother preceded him in death.

Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon at the home and at 2:30 pm at the church, with burial in the Decatur Cemetery. Rev. C. J. Miser of Atwood, formerly of Decatur, will officiate, assisted by Rev. R. R. Wilson of this city. The body will be removed from the Black Funeral Home to the residence this evening and may be viewed after 7 pm.
