Prominent Decatur Nurse Dies Sunday

Margaret Daniels is Taken by Death

Funeral services will be held Tuesday afternoon for Miss Margaret L. Daniels, 65, prominently known Decatur lady and World War I nurse, who died Sunday morning at the Veterans Hospital in Indianapolis.

Miss Daniels death was caused by heart trouble and followed an illness of five months. Until stricken, she was a member of the nurse's staff at the Adams County Memorial Hospital. She was a graduate of the Lutheran Nurses School at Fort Wayne.

She was born in Decatur in January, 1873, the daughter of Simpson and Amanda Hart-Daniels. She was a member of the First Christian Church in this city.

Military funeral services will be held under the direction of Adams Post No. 43, American Legion. An honor guard will escort the body from the church to the cemetery.

Services will be held at 1:30 o'clock Tuesday afternoon at the First Christian Church, with Rev. Kenneth Timmons officiating. Burial will be in the Decatur Cemetery.

Members of the nursing staff at the local hospital will act as pallbearers.

The body may be viewed at the Zwick Funeral Home this evening and until time for the services Tuesday.
