Mrs. Tom Lehman Dies Thursday

Lady Near Geneva Succumbs to Complications; Rites Sunday PM

Mrs. Anne Lehman, 49, wife of Tom Lehman, residing a half mile north of Geneva, midway between that town and the village of Ceylon, passed away at her home at 6 o'clock Thursday morning. Death was caused by complications, largely attributed to asthma, which finally affected her heart. She has been ill since the first of the year.

The deceased was born in Kansas on July 9, 1894, a daughter of Jonathan and Emma Pine-Mosser, but spent most of her life in this community.

Surviving are the husband, and three brothers and two sisters. They are Joe Mosser of Geneva; Clement Mosser of Albany; Albert Mosser of LaGrange and Mrs. Melvin Hall of Ossian.

A daughter preceded her in infancy.

Funeral services will be held on Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Geneva U.B. Church with Rev. R. S. Miller officiating. Burial will be in West Lawn Cemetery. The body may be viewed at the Wells and Hardy Funeral Home in Geneva.
