Mother of Mrs. Ida Lehman Dies Tuesday

Mrs. Israel Garber Passes at Pandora, Ohio - Funeral Friday

Mrs. Israel Garber, 80, of Pandora, Ohio, mother to Mrs. Ida Lehman of this place, passed away at her home in Pandora, Ohio Tuesday morning at 9 o'clock, according to a telephone message received here by Mrs. Lehman. Mrs. Garber had been ailing for some time with complications and death occurred on her 80th birthday.

The deceased, who was born Barbara Sutter, was a native of the Pandora community where she spent most of her life. For a time, she and her husband resided in Missouri, from where her daughter, Mrs. Lehman, moved here quite recently.

Surviving are the husband, who is 88, five daughters and two sons.

Funeral services will be held Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Grace Mennonite Church in Pandora.

Jonas Strahm Dies Late Last Night

Adams County Man Is Taken By Death

Jonas Strahm, 79, well known farmer of this county and father of Sylvan Strahm of this city, died at 11:45 o'clock last night at the Adams County Memorial Hospital of a heart ailment and complications.

Mr. Strahm was taken to the hospital Wednesday when his condition became critical. He had been making his home with his children for the past 18 years, since the death of his wife.

He was born in Wells County, April 23, 1863, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Mathew Strahm. He engaged in farming all his life.

Besides the son in this city, he is survived by the following children: Calvin of Bluffton; Melvin, Leo and Mrs. Jacob Haggard of Monroe; Mrs. A. E. Rich and Lewis of Berne, Edwin of Fort Wayne.

A sister, Mrs. John Schwartz of Syracuse, N.Y. and a brother, Daniel of Craigville, also survive.

The body will be moved from the Lobenstein Funeral Parlors to the home of the daughters, Mrs. Jacob Haggard in Monroe, Saturday morning, where it may be viewed by friends.

Funeral services will be held at two o'clock Sunday afternoon from the Defenseless Mennonite Church, with burial in the church cemetery.
