Mother's Declaration for Army Pension.

On this 15th day of June A. D. 1863, before me, (a) Clerk of the (b) Jackson Circuit Court a Court of Record in and for the County and State above named, personally appeared Mrs. (c) Mary Mondon aged 53 years, a resident of (d) Jackson County in the State of Indiana who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on her oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefits of the provision made by the act of Congress, approved July 14, 1862. That she is the widow of (e) Henry Mondon deceased Dec 29 1848 and the mother of (f) Jimmi Mondon deceased who was a (g) Private in Company (h) A commanded by Capt W. C. Hall in the (i) 69th Regiment of (j) Indiana Infantry Volunteers, in the war of 1861, and who (k) died at Chico Illinois on or about the 17th day of April 1863, while in the service of the United States by reason of (l) Camp Diarrhea contracted while in the line of his duty in the service of the United States

She further declares that her said son, upon whom she was wholly or in part dependent for support, having left no widow or minor child under sixteen years of age surviving, declarant makes this application for a pension, under the act of Congress approved July 14, 1862, and refers to the evidence filed herewith, and that in the proper department to establish her claim.

She also declares that she has not in any way been engaged in or aided or abetted the Rebellion in the United States, that she is not in receipt of a pension under the second section of the act above mentioned, or under any other act, and that she has not married since the death of her son, the soldier above named.

She hereby constitutes and appoints D. W. Lafayette of New Albany Ind her attorney, with power of substitution, to prosecute her claim, and procure and receive her pension when issued, with full power and authority to do and perform all and every lawful act and thing whatsoever necessary and requisite to be done in and about the premises. post

ing declaration in their presence, and were personally acquainted with her and her son before he entered the military service of

the United States. That her son, the said (f) Jimmi Mondon was the person who served

as stated in said declaration. That from their knowledge of and acquaintance with the family of the declarant and her son, the

soldier above named, they know that he left surviving no widow, or child, or children under sixteen years of age; that she was

wholly or in part dependent upon him for support. They know from personal knowledge being

near neighbor of said applicant for several years past. That she was

dependent upon her said son for support he being her only son and that

before he entered the army he contributed all his labor to the support

of said applicant and after entering the army he sent home for her support

being paid twice \$2.00 each time. Henry Mondon deceased

and that she was the wife and is now the widow of (e) Henry Mondon deceased

who died at the time above stated, and has been a widow since the death of her said son. That they reside as above stated and have no interest in the prosecution

of this claim. and said applicant has not aided or abetted the

DECLARATION FOR MOTHER'S ARMY PENSION.

State of Indiana

County of Jackson

ss:

On this 21st day of July A. D., one thousand eight hundred and sixty five personally appeared before me, John B Robertson Clerk of the Circuit Court within and for the County and State aforesaid Mary Maudan a resident of Ortwood Township in the County of Jackson and State of Indiana aged fifty six years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on her oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions made by the act of Congress, approved July 14, 1862. That she is the widow of Henry Maudan deceased and mother of Geniri Maudan who enlisted in the service of the United States at Jackson County in the State of Indiana on the threerd day of August 1862, as a private in Company F commanded by W C Hall Capt in the sixty seventh Regiment of Indiana Volunteer Infantry in the war of 1861; who, while in the service aforesaid, and in the line of his duty, Contracted the disease of Chronicorrhoea of which disease he afterwards died at Cairo in (Soldiers Home) in the State of Illinois on the 17th day of April A. D., 186 3. She further declares that she was married to Henry Maudan who was the father of Geniri Maudan aforesaid, on the 27th day of February in the year 18 42. The best evidence she can produce of her said marriage is as follows: The certificate of the said Marriage

That her husband, the aforesaid Henry Maudan died on the ninete day of December 18 47 at the Court, of Washington in the State of Indiana

And she further declares that her said son, upon whom she was wholly or in part dependant for support, having left no widow, or minor child under sixteen years of age, surviving, declarant makes this application for a Pension, under the above mentioned act, and refers to the evidence filed herewith, and that in the proper department, to establish her claim.

She also declares that she has not, in any manner, been engaged in or aided or abetted the rebellion in the United States; that she is not in receipt of a pension under the second section of the act above mentioned, or under any other act, nor has she again married since the death of her son, the said Geniri Maudan

She hereby appoints Ralph Applewhite of Brownstown
County of Jackson State of Indiana her true and
lawful Attorney, with full power of substitution to prosecute this claim for pension, and to receive
the certificate to be issued therefor. She requests that her pension be paid at the
Indianapolis Agency, State of Indiana. Her Post
Office address is Valparaiso County of Jackson
State of Indiana.

County of Jackson State of Indiana whom I certify to be
respectable and entitled to credit, and who, being by me first duly sworn, say they were present
and saw Mrs Mary Mandon sign her name

to the foregoing declaration and power of attorney; and they
further swear that they have every reason to believe, from the appearance of the applicant, and
their acquaintance with her for twenty years that she is the identical person
she represents herself so be; that they were well acquainted with her son, the aforesaid
Genri Mandon deceased, and fully believe from their
personal knowledge of them, that she is the mother of said deceased, and they know that she was
wholly ~~or in part~~ dependant on her said son for support; that prior to entering the service of the
United States he contributed to her support, He lived out by the month
when he could get work and for several seasons before
going into the service he raised crops on rented lands and
his said mother received the proceeds of his labor
and since being in the service aforesaid, a portion of his pay has been transmitted to her for her
sustenance We know of his sending her money at one time
and it was generally reported and believed in the neighborhood
that he sent her money several times.

and further, that said Mary Mandon is poor, and has no
income save what is contributed by friends, or earned by her own labor; and they believe her un-
able to earn her subsistence, by reason of Age and physical disability
and further, that her said son

left surviving no widow, or minor child under sixteen years, and that said

Mary Mandon is the widow of Henry Mandon
who died on the 9th day of Decr 1847. They attended his
funeral and lived in his immediate neighborhood at
the time of his death and for several years previous thereto

The best evidence they have of her marriage with the father of the deceased, is as follows:
that we lived near neighbors to the said Henry Mandon deceased
for several years before and at the time of his death
and know that he and the said Mary lived together as husband
and wife and were so regarded by their neighbors
and they know she has not again married since the death of her son, the said

Genri Mandon nor has she in any manner aided or abetted the rebellion

All of which statements are made from personal knowledge, derived from intimate acquaintance with the family, and the circumstances surrounding them; and they further declare, that they have no interest in the prosecution of this claim. *nor are they in any manner related to the said Applicant.*

Adj. Gen. reports Zimriah Mondon enrolled Aug. 12th 1862, and discharged Apr. 10/63.

Death.

Surg. Gen. reports same at Perkins Plantation La. on acct. of Phtisis Pulmonalis, disability 1/2. Certificate of disability shows Phtisis Pulmonalis, supposed to be hereditary, disability total. Capt. testifies he contracted Chronic Diarrhoea in the Yazee swamps in service & line of duty. Sent to Hospital with same. Discharged for same & died at Soldiers home in Cairo Ill. Apr. 17th 1863. Family Physician testifies he was in good health at time of enlistment & not predisposed to pulmonary affection, or hereditary. Established by credible witnesses.

Affidavits of credible witnesses: died in 1848 as shown by credible witnesses. Whole property valued at 100 dollars, no income, a cripple, aged & infirm. Testified by credible witnesses, also that for last five years Soldier gave all the proceeds of his labor for her support & after his enlistment sent 20 dolls. two different times for her support, having been paid but twice, Averred.
