
Richard Theodore Antrim

Richard Theodore "Scrub" Antrim, age 84, former Jay County resident, died Thursday Jan. 22, 2015, at Indiana Soldiers' Home, West Lafayette, following a lengthy illness. Born in Delaware County on June 5, 1930, he was the son of Francelle & Martha (Worl) Antrim. He grew up in Yorktown and was a 1949 graduate of Yorktown High School where he played basketball and baseball. After high school he joined the U.S. Air Force and was in active duty



during the Korean War before receiving an honorable discharge. Dick worked at Delco Remy and Warner Gear, and with his wife Janellyn built & operated Country Manor Nursing Homes in Dunkirk and Hartford City (now known as Millers Merry Manor) for 14 years. An avid reader and history buff, he also enjoyed traveling extensively – particularly overseas. In later years he moved closer to Indianapolis to be near family.
