Postmaster at Bryant for 47 years, Joseph Cline Huey, 47, a resident of RR 1, Bryant, died Sunday morning in the morning in the Clinic Hospital in Bluffton, after an illness of one month. He was a member of the National Postmaster of the United States. A veteran of World War II, he was a member of the American Legion Post 211 at Portland. He was affiliated with the Faith Lutheran Church at Bryant. A great master of Mason Lodge 621 at Geneva, he was secretary of the lodge at the time of his death. He was also a member of the Order of Eastern Star 263 at Geneva, Jay chapter No. 107 at Portland, Scottish Rite at Fort Wayne, and Commandry York Rite at Muncie.

Born March 18, 1920, Portland, he was the son of Sangor and Goldie (Daugherty) Huey. On Aug. 22, 1942, he was married to Betty L. Knoelke, who survives along with two sons, Joseph E., serving with the Second Field Forces in Vietnam, and Donald D., Fort Lee, Va.; one brother, Thurlow Huey, Bearcreek Township; one sister, Mrs. Charleen Moyer, Madison, Township, and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Sangor Huey, Bearcreek Township.
