E. T. WILLIAMS DEAD Portland Man Succeeds With Third Attempt of Life

ANDERSON, Ind., May 11 - E. T. Williams, a wealthy man of Portland, Ind., was found dead in a room at the Columbia hotel Tuesday afternoon. Lying on a bed near the man's hand was a bottle half filled with chloroform. He arrived at the hotel early in the day and registered as "R. H. Henson, Portland." He carried considerable money, a fine gold watch and wore a diamond on his shirt front. It was learned that the dead man was a wealthy retired merchant of Philadelphia and that he twice before attempted suicide, once at Portland and at Muncie last Monday when he took morphine.
