

GEO. AXE DIES ON SUNDAY EVE

Funeral Will be Tuesday From the Mt. Zion Church.

George Axe died at 5:40 p.m. Sunday at his home on East High street. He had been an invalid for about six years, following an attack of rheumatism, but had been seriously ill only about two weeks.

The deceased was a son of Charles and Mary (Antles) Axe and was born in Bearcreek township February 1, 1852. He had spent his entire life in this county, moving from his farm to this city seven years ago.

He was united in marriage to Elizabeth Kimble, April 22, 1875, who preceded him in death January 2, 1900. His second marriage was to Nancy Chamberlain, September 14, 1901, who survives.

One son, William C. Axe, and one daughter, Mrs. Wes F. Metzner, both of Noble township, survive. He is also survived by four grandsons, four great granddaughters and one sister, Mrs. Emily Garbric, also of Noble township.

The body was removed to the Baird funeral home and prepared for interment, after which it was taken to the family home this morning. Funeral services will be conducted Tuesday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock from the Mt. Zion Evangelical church, eight miles northeast of this city. Rev. Elmer Yoh, the pastor will officiate. Interment will be made in the church cemetery.
