Mrs. Margaret Andrews died Wednesday morning at six o'clock at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Joseph Harter at Salamonia. The deceased was born April 28, 1814 and died at the good, old age of ninety years. Her husband has been dead for nearly fifty years and she leaves a family of married children. The funeral services were held Friday morning at ten o'clock from the Salamonia Church, in charge of Rev. S. A. Armstrong. Interment at Salamonia.

Margaret, daughter of Adam and Catharine Rodabaugh was born April 28, 1814, near

Dayton, Ohio. She was the oldest of a family of twelve children and is survived by two brothers and two sisters. At the age of twenty-five, she was united in marriage to George L. Andrews. In May 28, 1854, the husband died, leaving to her care seven children, the oldest but twelve years of age. During the period of her great struggle to provide for her family, she sent her three oldest sons to fight in defense of the Union. She suffered from ill health during the greater portion of her life, but survived her oldest children twenty-seven years and her husband fifty years. She died in Salamonia on July 20, 1904, aged ninety years, two months and twenty-two days, and left to six children, thirty-two grandchildren and nineteen greatgrandchildren the example of a life of Christian fortitude and loving service. The funeral services were held Friday morning at ten o'clock from the Salamonia Church, in charge of Rev. S. A. Armstrong; interment at Salamonia.
