DUTIES FOR OFFICERS

All officer to Help Decorate

President – Select Speaker and gift. Appoint Decorating Committee. Gift for Honorary Member. Appoint nominating and table and chairs committee (usually used the 6th grade boys). Entertainment and Dinner music. Oversee all committees. Conduct over Banquet. Get Caterers.

Vice President – gifts for oldest member and farthest travelled. Usually gives invocation. Takes care of plaque with highest %.

Recording Secretary – Minutes from Meeting and Banquet. Sends letters to Seniors (special letter inviting them to come (paid) and to join.

Correspondence Secretary – Keep all addresses current. Send all paid-up alumni invitation plus all of honor years and honorary members. Make-out program. Note: these two and the treasurer were were all combined later on. Bless Rosie Hester!!

Treasurer – Write all checks (band, meal, decorations, etc).

1965 – The annual Waveland Alumni Banquet was held in the high school gymnasium on Saturday, May 29, 1965. A nautical theme was carried throughout the gym on tables with nets, seashells, streams and anchors. Anchors with the numbers of the honored years were suspended from a blue ceiling. Over the graduating classes table were anchors with letters spelling Seniors. Bouquets of blue carnations were on the speaker's table and the seniors table. After Pres. Carrol Graham gave seating directions, the invocation was given by Norman Walker. Mrs. Zelma Spencer furnished dinner music on the organ and piano. Carroll Graham welcomed the alumni and thanked the Russellville Christian Church for serving the meal. The president then thanked Mrs. Spencer for the music and introduced those seated at the speaker table who were Mr. and Mrs. Charles Simpson, Miss Sally Milligan, Malcolm Simpson, Mr. and Mrs. Don Patton, Ralph Williams and Mr. and Mrs. Carroll Graham. The members of the various committees were asked to stand to be thanked for their part in making the banquet a success. Don Whitecotton read the names for next years officers. Ralph Williams, President; Larry Williams, Vice President; Marjorie Davis, recording secretary; Charles Simpson, treasurer; and Mr. and Mrs. Jon Mitchell, corresponding secretaries. The nomination were accepted and new officers were asked to stand and be recognized. The Waveland principal and senior sponsor, Donald Cooper was introduced and he told the alumni some things about the graduating class. Cooper then introduced Ron Patton, president of the Senior class. Ron on behalf of the class thanked the association for the evening and expressed his hope they would become worth members of the alumni. He then introduced each member of the graduating class. President Graham introduced Don Patton, 1947 Alumnus and past president of the association as toastmaster for the evening. He introduced a member of each class ending in 0 and 5 to act as spokesman and present the members and their guests from the classes. The minutes of the 1964 banquet were read and approved. The treasurer reported 184 reservations made for this year plus 19 seniors. The honorary member for 1965 was awarded to Mrs. Kenneth Milligan and she was presented with a membership scroll and bouquet of red roses from her family. The remainder of the evening was spent in conversation, cards and dancing to the music of the Gary Douglas Band from Crawfordsville. Punch was served during the dance from a table decorated in the nautical theme. Elaine Cosby, Rhoda Nixon, Karen Bazzani and Carol Presslor served at the punch table assisted by Mrs. Marjorie Davis, Mrs. Bob Gooding and Mrs. Jon Mitchell. President Carol Graham – Rec. Sec. Sally Milligan. Note: Committee members met and the dinner committee brought forth suggestions and each discussed. Decided to just let the committee choose the caterer and menu. Agreed to get Gary Douglas Band for \$100. 28 tables will be rented at 50 cents per table per day – FFA boys will be paid \$25 to deliver and return them. A plaque for retired teachers was discussed and decided to let the Booster Club take charge of this. The invitation letter was read and corrected. These will be mimeographed at the school. Melba Mitchell made the motion dues be raised to \$1 – seconded by John Moody – will take effect this year. Meal will be \$2.25 person. Decorating shell be cut this year – no false ceilings. 1966 Minutes – Waveland Alumni Association Banquet

The Waveland Alumni Banquet was held in the School gymnasium May 28, 1966. The gym was beautifully decorated in the theme of Moonlight and Roses with the moon shining from one corner lit by a beam, a water fall surrounded by ferns and flowers with colored lights shining on it. The tables were decorated with blue candel in the center and roses on each end and silver nut cups. The honor tables were decorated with silver stars with class numbers ending in 1 and 6. Mrs. Zelma Spencer played before and during the delicious supper served by the Russellville Christian Church to 242 Alumni and guests. Rev. Philip Hodgkin, an alumni with the class of 1950 gave the invocation. The head table had a bowl of red roses and white chrysanthemums for the center piece. Ralph Williams, president, called the meeting to order by thanking Mrs. Spencer for the lovely music on the organ and piano; the church men and

women for the wonderful meal they prepared and served, a hand of appreciation was given to Mr. Warnick for the use of the organ. Mr. Williams then introduced those at the speakers table; Mr. and Mrs. Donald Cooper; Mr. and Mrs. Charles Simpson; Rev. and Mrs. Philip Hodgkin; Mr. and Mrs. Larry Williams; Mr. and Mrs. Jon Mitchell; Mr and Mrs. Robert Gooding and Mr. and Mrs. Cecil N. Davis. Mr. Williams then introduced the other members of committees who helped make the alumni a wonderful meeting those being decoration: Mrs. Linda Milligan; Mrs. Jennifer France; Mrs. Lois Morgan; Mrs. James Thomas and Roger Johnson. Dinner: Mrs. Helen Jean Patton; Mrs. Helen Weaver and Mrs. Delores Reynolds. Nominating: Myron Banta. Table and Chairs, Dale Sowers. Band: Richard Howell and Kent Evans. Mrs. Cecil Davis read the minutes of the 1965 alumni meeting and these were approved as read. Charlie Simpson gave the treasurer report. Report of the nomination committee was as follows for 1967. Officers, President – Larry Williams; V Pres Karl Moser. Treasurer – Charles Simpson; Recording Secretary, Miss Pamela Sharpe; Corresponding Sec Mr. and Mrs. Jon Mitchell. The motion was made and seconded the nomination being closed. The Alumni accepted these as new officers for 1967. The Pres. Ralph Williams then introduced Mr. Myron Banta, senior class sponsor who in turn introduced the seniors who were guests of the Alumni. Their table center piece was blue and white carnations, their class colors. Seniors present were Carol Pressler, Linda Myers, Rita Allen, Arlene Layne, Rusty Weaver, Darrel West, Richard Stultz, Dennis McCarty, Danny Weatherman, Kenny Brewer, Carol Miller and Linda Weaver. Mr. Williams welcomed them into the Alumni Association. Carol Pressler gave the response for the graduating class. The Alumni President then gave a few remarks on the Toastmaster, Robert Gooding; his past school at Waveland, Indiana State College and his masters degree at Purdue University. Mr. Gooding then introduced his wife. He began by saying we live in a space age cause there was a spucknic up by Russia, then they sent a munick up and now ready to send a pinick up. Also there should be legislature for women to wear their skirts at least 3 or 4 years longer. Then he presented to both Max Dillman Class of 1918 and Glen Hooker class of 1935 from California a gift for their coming the farthest distance. (imagine Max was oldest but typed as noted). He introduced the past presidents: Present 1941 Elton Milligan; 1955 Don Patton; 1958 John Patton; 1961 Richard Johnson; 1962 David Grimes; 1963 Dennis Moody; 1964 Charles Simpson; 1965 Caroll Graham. Mr. Gooding then introduced a spokesman for each honor class and asked each class to see if they could name the 500 mile winner that year along with who won the world series.

1906 – Carl Pater – 16 graduated and he was only one present. 1911 – Mrs. Lucy Motter McClain – 13 graduated – 5 living and she only one here. 1916 – Elton Milligan – 17 graduated and one other present. 1921 – Virginia Moore Foster – 23 graduated. 1926 – Kathryn Patton Mason -18 graduated. 1931 – George Lamson – 23 graduated and 2 present. 1936 – Helen Jean Loman Patton – 17 graduated – she only one present. 1941 – Charles Priebe – 19 graduated and 5 present. 1946 – Barara McBrayer Proffitt – 11 graduate 3 present. 1951 – Larry Dean Servies – 22 graduated and 7 present. 1956 – Dennis Moody – 23 graduated and 8 present. 1961 – James Thomas – 20 graduated and 6 present. To the Honor class 1966 Mr. Gooding had this advice. Keep your eyes on the road, your ears to the ground, your shoulder to the wheel, your nose to the grindstone. The attendance trophy again went to the class of 1902 with three graduates and all present. Mr. Walter Penn, Mr. Ira Sharp and Mr. Alonzo Deere. Their names will be engraved on the plaque at the school. The Honor alumnus this year was unable to attend due to injury. This certificate went to Mrs. Doris Grimes along with the certificate was sent a dozen roses from the alumni. The president, Ralph Williams then thanked all for coming and the meeting was adjourned with Mr. Williams asking all to visit the school one again or to visit while the tables were being removed. The evening was spent in dancing to the Gary Douglas band, playing cards and visiting. The Punch table was beautifully arranged. Sharon McClure, Sally Patton, Betty and Beverly Myers, Kathy Hazlett served the rose-colored punch from a lovely punch bowl during the social hours, assisted by Mrs. Helen Jean Patton. President: Ralph Williams. Rec. Secretary, Mrs. Marjorie Davis. Note: The 1966 Alumni Officers and committee members met Feb 20, 1966 at the Waveland HS Library for their first meeting of the year. Ralph Williams, the president called the meeting to order at 2:30 p.m. The minutes of the last committee meeting was read and the correction was made by Jim Thomas and seconded by Dick Howell that the invitations be sent to the last three years instead of four to the members who have paid their dues plus all honor classes. The treasurer gave the report of the expenses of the last alumni Banquet item for item. There were approximately 600 invitations sent and of those, 200 paid their dues and 164 returned with paid reservations. Several suggestions were discussed on more attendance. Larry Williams suggested one member from each class contact their members and encourage them to attend. It was also voted the Past presidents of the alumni be honored. Larry William made motion Lois

Ann Morgan seconded it. Classes of 1 and 6 will be the honor classes this year. The date of the Banquet will be May 28, 1966. The next meeting will be held the same place March 27 at 2:30 p.m. The discussion on the theme was left to Linda Milligan and her committee. Discussion on the tables and how many and when to pick up Larry Williams is to be responsible for the seniors invitations. Those present were Ralph, Larry Williams; Marjorie Davis; Melba Mitchell; Charles Simpson; Lois Ann Morgan; Helen Weaver; Delores Reynolds; Robert Gooding; Richard Howell; Jim Thomas; Roger Johnson; Jennifer France and Linda Milligan. Several committee members were unable to attend. The motion made meeting be adjourned. Note 2 – The second meeting (March 27, 1966) of the officers and committee members met at the Waveland School building Sun afternoon at 2:30 p.m. March 27, 1966. Mr. Ralph Williams called the meeting to order by reading a letter to be sent to different organizations concerning the coming alumni banquet. The minutes of the last meeting were read by the sec, Mrs. Marjorie Davis and were approved. Mrs. Melba Mitchell read the letter to be sent to the alumni; it was also approved. Mrs. Helen Jean Patton read the menu – smothered steak, tomato juice, baked potatoes, green beans, apple ring, tossed salad, butter, rolls, pie, coffee, iced tea. It was announced the band had been signed up to play. The theme is Moonlite and Roses. The officers were reported on for next year, this to be brought up at Alumni Banquet for approval. Registration to begin at 5:45 p.m. Serving at 6:30. Those present Ralph Williams, Pres; Mrs. Marjorie Davis, Sec; Mrs. Melba Mitchell, corres sec; Charles Simpson, Treas; Mrs. Jennifer France; Mrs. Linda Milligan; Mrs. Lois Ann Morgan; Mrs. Helen Jean Patton and Jim Thomas. Meeting adjourned at 3:30.

1967 Waveland Alumni Association Meeting (Banquet)

The annual Waveland HS Alumni Banquet was held on May 27, 1967 in the gymnasium. The theme for the evening was Tijuana Night and the gym was decorated with streamers, table decorations and balloons in colors of yellow, orange and brown. The business meeting was called to order by the president, Larry Williams. Recognition was given to Mrs. Lowell Spencer for piano and organ music during the dinner; to the cooks and the class of 1969 for the dinner; to Mr. Warnick for the use of the organ and to Mr. TS Banta for making the honor scroll each year. Pamela Sharpe Bloomer read the minutes of the 1966 meeting and they were approved.
