

GLADYS ELLIS - steals money - off to prison

Deputy John Foster and wife yesterday took Gladys Ellis to the women's prison in Indianapolis where she began serving her term of from 1-8 years. Sentence, which had been suspended by Judge West in Circuit Court was enforced when she was brought before the court again following the alleged theft of a \$5 bill from her grandmother. No new charges were filed, since she was enjoying her freedom under a suspended sentence following her plea of guilty a few weeks ago to the theft of a sum of money from BC Haislip. When the Ellis girl was arrested Saturday night she attempted to chew up the evidence and party succeeded.
