John Inlow - Accident

John Inlow and wife who left this place for Iowa some 10 days ago, happened with an accident in that state, 25 miles from Albia, which were very serious to Mrs. Inlow. The particulars are that at about 4 o'clock in the morning as the train was making around a curve, the track spread, turning one coach and baggage car completely over into the ditch. Mr. & Mrs. Inlow were asleep on the opposite side, and of course were hurled with great force. Mrs. Inlow's head and shoulders striking the car just above the opposite hat rack, breaking in the wainscoting. She received two deep gashes in the forehead, and severe internal injuries. At last account she was better.
