

CHARLES KEYS - falls from Indy Street car

New Market, Ind Jan 9 - Charles Keys, one of the most prominent farmers living near New Market, is in an Indianapolis hospital suffering from injuries received in a severe fall which he had from a street car there. Keys was in Indianapolis to attend a meeting of the Indiana Swine Breeder's Association. Wednesday evening he boarded a street car to go to the home of his brother, Allie Keys, on Downey Avenue to spend the night. As he attempted to leave the car at Downey Avenue, he was thrown heavily upon the back of his head, causing a bad scalp wound and rendering him unconscious. When Mr. Keys was picked up and taken to the hospital, it was thought that he could live but a short time. The report received by his family here was that his skull had been crushed and that he could not recover. A report from Indianapolis this morning, however, stated that he merely had suffered a bad scalp wound and that although severely hurt he was not in a serious condition. Mrs. Keys, his wife, left New Market, this morning to be at his bedside.
