## CULVER HOSPITAL RECEIVES \$ FROM DARWIN ENOCH

The L.L. Culver Union hospital will benefit from the will of Darwin S. Enoch, which was filed yesterday in the local circuit court. He leaves \$2,000 to the hospital, and the remainder he gives to Mary Edith Kern, his niece, living in San Diego, Cal. Miss Kern was also named executrix, and yesterday appeared before the judge to take bond for the place. The estate of Mr. Enoch's which is valued at near \$20,000 is principally in Crawfordsville. He owns 11 acres of land near the outskirts of the city, besides having his home about \$2,000 worth of personal property. Mary Edith Kern, who is named as the receipient of most of the property is now in the city. She came here to attend her uncle's funeral and is remaining to settle up his business affairs in this city. The will was made October 3, 1913, and signed by two local witnesses one of whom was present at the initial reading of the will when she reaffirmed her signature - typed by kbz
