Among Old Records – June 10, 1837 – Crawfordsville and Union was divided into four districts for road working, and the supervisors were William Binford, John M. Fishers, AP Watson and William S. Galey. The dividing lines were down Main and Washington Streets. Dan Hartsock, AP and WP Watson, and James S. Vancleave were licensed to vent foreign merchandise. The county assessors for 1837 were paid as follows: James D. Spair, \$65.75; Thomas A. Coolley, 446.50; Thomas W. Lampson, 458.50. Silas Grantham was granted a license to sell liquor. PM Curry resigned on May 3, 1837 as county agent and Sam D. Vance was appointed. Among the grand jurors for Sept 1837 term is the name of Robert W. McMaken and Jeremiah West was among the traverse jurors. Henry Liter was a traverse juror drawn for the March term, 1838. Dan Easley was appointed tax collector The license to vend wooden clocks was \$50 a year. The commissioners agreed to pay half the cost of a bridge across Sugar Creek on North Washington Street if the citizens would pay half.
