

JACKSON McCORMACK - purchases mansion

Miami, Fla - Dec 26 - Jackson McCormack, a retired capitalist of Crawfordsville, Ind and prominent resident of that city, yesterday purchased a mansion in this city, to be used as a winter residence for himself and wife. The magnificent residence of Spanish architecture is located in a colony of beautiful homes of Spanish type which is known as Espanola Way between Collins and Washington Avenues. It was formerly owned by William F. Whitman, a well-to-do-resident of Miami Beach. The consideration was \$15,000 which was paid in cash by Mr. McCormack. The house is elaborate and complete in every detail. It consists of 7 rooms, two baths and a garage. It is situated on the South side of the street and is one of the most attractive homes in this section. On a visit to Miami Beach, Mr. McCormack saw the newly constructed Spanish colony and his attention was immediately drawn to the beautiful style of architecture and the splendid situation of the building. So greatly was Mr. McCormack impressed that it took him but a short time to complete the purchase and decide to make this his home for the winter. Mr. and Mrs. McCormack have been spending winters in Lakeland, Fla about 200 miles north of Miami for the past 4 years and had taken a residence in that city but making a recent visit to Miami Beach they were favorably impressed, changed their minds and decided to locate here. They will give up the Lakeland residence and move here January 9.
