## HARRY NAYLOR's home - bad fire

The fire at Harry Naylor's residence Wednesday afternoon in similar to that as Mrs. Voris' the other night in that it is difficult to account for the origin. It appears to have started in the rear portion of the house but when the fire department arrived smoke was pouring out from the cornice on all sides and the blaze seemed to spread between several partitions and between the ceiling and the floors of the second story. The department contrived to get it under control but not until considerable damage had been wrought. The water, too, played havoc generally freezing as it fell. Most of the goods on the lower floor were carried out but not without more or less damage. Mr. Naylor carried \$1800 insurance on his house and \$500 on the goods. This will probably replace it in case it ever gets warm again but Mr. Naylor and family feel, and not without cause, that they can never be repaid for the inconvenience to which they have been put. They will rent property until they can rebuild. Several students occupied upstairs rooms and suffered some damage from water – typed by kbz
