Crawfordsville's first case of smallpox in more than two years was reported by the physician attending Harold Flora, better known as Harold Miller, and a stepson of Henry Miller, living at 908 West Market Street. The physician pronounced the case as fully developed smallpox and the patient has been closely quarantined. All those who have been exposed to the disease and who were not vaccinated are being inoculated. The prompt action taken in the case seems to have removed any possibility of an epidemic.
