

James W. Kane, 62, dies Sunday

James W. Kane, 62, of 9802 Greenmoor drive, New Haven, former Decatur businessman, was dead on arrival at the Parkview memorial hospital in Fort Wayne at 2:45 p.m. Sunday. He had been ill for the past 10 months.

Mr. Kane owned and operated the Kane Paint & Wallpaper store on South Second street in this city for 13 years until seven years ago, when he moved to New Haven. He was employed as a salesman for Ream-Steckbeck Paint Co. until becoming ill.

He was born in Fort Wayne Aug. 14, 1909, a son of Daniel W. and Margaret O'Neal-Kane. He was a veteran of World War II.

Mr. Kane was a member of St. John's Catholic church at New Haven, TPA, Fort Wayne, and American Legion post 330, New Haven.

Surviving are his wife, the former Miss Frances M. Odie; and three sons, Daniel W., Jeffrey, and Jerome Kane, all at home.

Services will be held at 9:40 a.m. Wednesday at the E. Harper & Son funeral home at New Haven and at 10 a.m. at St. John's Catholic church. Rev. Daniel Leeuw will officiate, and the burial will be in the church cemetery. Friends may call at the funeral home Tuesday from 2 to 5 and 7 to 9 p.m. The rosary will be recited at 8 p.m. Tuesday.
