Memorial services for C.M. Sgt. William Moss Leopold, 47, ranking non-commissioned officer in the U.S. Air Force, and a brother of Mrs. John Schmitt of route 3, were held last Thursday at Kingsley Field, Klamath Falls, Oregon.
