

**JOSEPH STUCKY, 69, DIES AT FORT WAYNE
RITES THURSDAY FOR COUNTY NATIVE.
BROTHER OF GENEVA PEOPLE**

Services will be held Thursday for Joseph Stucky, 69, of Ft. Wayne, who died at 6:05 a.m. yesterday in Lutheran hospital, where he had been a patient since Friday. Mr. Stucky was one of the founders of the Stucky Brothers Home Appliance Co. in Fort Wayne.

Services will be held at 2:30 p.m. Thursday at the Trinity Lutheran church, Dr. Paul H. Krauss officiating. Burial will be in Lindenwood cemetery. Friends may call at the C. O. McComb & Sons Funeral Home in Ft. Wayne.

A native of Adams county, Mr. Stucky was a longtime resident of Fort Wayne. He resided at 2126 N. Anthony Blvd. and was a member of Trinity English Lutheran church.

A pioneer in the appliance field, Mr. Stucky and his two brothers, the late Elmer and Christ Stucky, founded the Home Appliance Co. in Ft. Wayne in 1914.

Surviving him are his wife, Della; one son, Kenneth J., secretary-treasurer of the Stucky Bros. Home Appliance; two daughters, Mrs. Robert I. Benninghoff, Fort Wayne, and Mrs. J. Luther Jordan, Baton Rouge, La.; three brothers, Ivan, Decatur, Eli, Geneva, and Albert Woodburn; three sisters, Mrs. J. D.
