

Elizabeth Brosius, 74, Dies Thursday

Mrs. Elizabeth Brosius, 74, 329 ½ East Main Street, died at 12:10 o'clock yesterday afternoon at the Knepp Sanitarium at Rome City, where she had been a patient since April 14.

Mrs. Brosius was born in Brooklyn, N.Y., and was brought here at the age of seven when her father, Michael Cunningham, was transferred here by the Nickel Plate Railroad, which then was laying its first track through the city. She was the widow of Jesse Brosius, an automobile dealer and former member of the City Council and the Board of Public Works.

She was a member of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, the Rosary Society, the Daughters of Isabella and the Society of the Little Flower.

Surviving are a son, Harry J. Brosius; a sister, Mrs. Mart Wright of Fort Wayne; two brothers, William Cunningham of Chicago and Charles Cunningham of the U.S. Navy, and two grandchildren.

The body may be viewed at the home after Saturday night. Funeral services will be held at 8:30 am Monday at the Mungovan & Sons Mortuary and at 9 am at the Cathedral. Burial will be in Lindenwood.
