RED CROSS NURSE DIES IN HOSPITAL

Mrs. Hazel Dickson Tripp, 37, DeKalb County Red Cross nurse and daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James G. Dickson of this city, died early today at the Robert Long Hospital in Indianapolis from cerebral embolus.

Funeral services will be held at the Methodist Church Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock (CDT) with Rev. H. J. Jordan, pastor of the Garret Presbyterian Church and Rev. Walter Elliott, pastor of the Hicksville Presbyterian Church, officiating. The body was brought here today by George W. Iker, Garret undertaker and will be taken to the home of her parents Monday morning.

Given a leave of absence from her post when she was awarded a fellowship in public health nursing, Mrs. Tripp was attending Indiana University at Bloomington when she was found unconscious in her dormitory room only a week ago.

Born in Marlette, Mich., Mrs. Tripp was graduated from Garrett High School in 1922. After receiving her nurse's training at Wesley Memorial Hospital in Chicago, she did private duty and later became head of the children's department of Austin Hospital, Chicago. Mrs. Tripp was working on her Bachelor of Science degree for which she had previously studied at Ohio State University at Columbus.

Surviving besides the parents are two sisters, Mrs. Wilda Denyes of Garrett and Doris Rose Dickson, at home, and a brother, Mervin Dickson of Garrett.
