They will always be travelling away from the sunset, and toward the dawn.

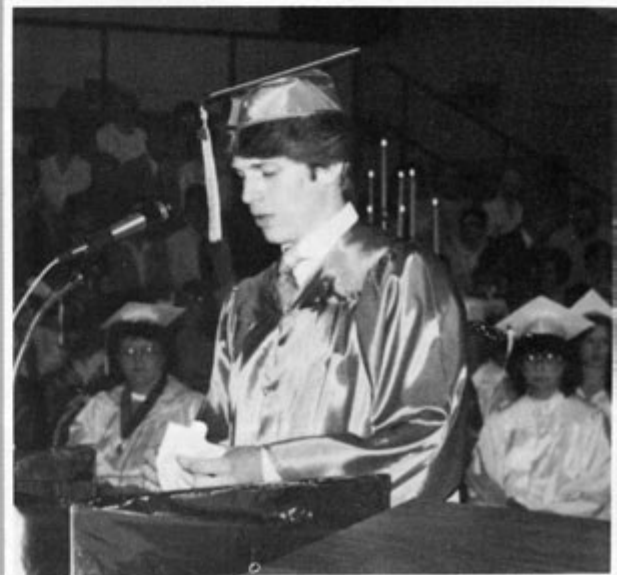
