




BOYS VARSITY BASKETBALL



Rick McClain led the team in rebounds with 127 and field goal accuracy at 58%. Charlie Martin had the best free throw percentage, 77%, and the most assists, 108. Richie Bovair added 67 assists and Mark Barajas averaged 7.7 ppg. David Stanley scored 10.3 ppg.










GIRLS VARSITY BASKETBALL






GOLF



This years tennis team only consisted of seven players. No sophomores or no senior players, just freshmen and juniors and they did very well and worked hard as a team. They were a good team and played hard.














BASEBALL




