well known to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declared in relation to aforesaid case as follows:

That she has known the claimant Emeline Orwick ever since she

Can remember anyone her first marriage was to George Hooker her 2nd marriage was to James Barker he died about the latter part of 1874 but her folks were at the funeral he was buried at Barkes

Chapel as to how she fix the date that the claimant married William Orwick about 11 months after Barker died.

Were all raised in the same neighborhood and is still a neighbor of claimant. Have known William Orwick

the soldier ever since. Can remember anyone he was first married to Emaline Mills she died in about 1870

as I was about 6 years old as affiant's mother nursed her in her last sickness and took care of the child after her

death he was married to Emaline Barker and from personal knowledge know that she was never married

but three times and he twice in their lifetime and that they were together without divorce or separation of any kind from the

date of their marriage to the date of William Orwick's death

She further declares that she has no interest in said case and is not concerned in its prosecution
