IDA COCHRAN DIES MONDAY LONG ILLNESS

PARALYSIS FATAL TO RESI-
DENT OF WEST SIXTH
STREET MONDAY.

At Montpelier.

Mrs. Ida May Cochran, 66, wife
of Willard Cochran, died at 5:30
o'clock Monday morning at her
home, 122 west Sixth street, this
city, following an illness with pa-
ralysis.

Mrs. Cochran had been in ill
health since an initial stroke of
paralysis two years ago and then
two weeks ago suffered another
stroke. She had been bedfast and
critically ill since that time.

Funeral services will be conduct-
ed from the Burk and Fenning chap-
el at 2 o'clock Wednesday after-
noon, with burial following at the
Montpelier I. O. O. F. cemetery.
The body will lay in state at the
chapel.

Born in New Castle, February 23,
1873, Ida May Cochran was the
daughter of Samuel and Mary
Bales. She spent her earlier life
there and was married a first time
to Charles S. Runkle, now deceased.
Surviving from this union are six
children: Oscar Runkle, of Mont-
pelier, Mrs. Veda Attaway, Mrs.
Clayton Moore and Miss Helen
Runkle, all of Fort Wayne, Mrs.
Alice M. Turner, of Tulsa, Okla.,
and Franklin Runkle, of Hartford
City.

The decedent was married a sec-
ond time to Willard Cochran twenty-
nine years ago. Surviving be-
sides him, is one son, Verl Cochran,
of this city. There are also seven
grandchildren and one great grand-
child.

The family had lived in this city
for the past four years and previous
to that time had resided intermit-
tently here, at Montpelier and in
Illinois.

Mrs. Cochran was a member of
the Montpelier Christian church.
